Advent and Christmas Events

Everyone is invited to an Advent Vespers Service on Sunday, Dec 1, at 4:00 PM. Begin the season of preparation for Christ's birth by hearing the promises of Scripture, singing songs of praise, and offering prayers to God. A light meal will follow the service.

Vespers is a service of evening prayer and praise. The word for this prayer time comes from the Latin vesper, meaning "evening." Vespers is part of the Liturgy of the Hours, also known as the Divine Office and is traditionally held in the early evening. The service contains psalms, hymns, and prayers of intercession for the needs of the world.

Our annual Christmas program will be held on Sunday, Dec 22, at 4:00 PM. Practices are being held during the Sunday School time. An offering will be received during the program for Lennox Area Ministerial Association and the Center of Hope.

The Lennox Area Ministerial Association includes 11 churches. The pastors meet monthly and provide assistance in our community.

Center of Hope in Sioux Falls exists to walk alongside people, to bring spiritual and physical health, and ultimately change the community one life at a time. Programs include a free clinic, bike ministry, care center (clothing, counseling, and more), earn your way, reentry backpack program, and sharing Christmas.

Christmas Eve Worship on December 24 will begin at 5:00 PM. The service will include candlelight and the Lord's Supper. A special offering will be received for Inspiration Hills and the Union Gospel Mission.

Inspiration Hills Camp & Retreat Center near Inwood, Iowa, bases its ministry on sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The aim is for people to know and grow in Christ and be challenged for life in God's kingdom. Inspiration Hills offers retreats, camps, vacations, camping, family reunions, outdoor activities, and so much more.

Union Gospel Mission is a nonprofit emergency shelter dedicated to providing essential services to the homeless, needy, and marginalized people of the Sioux Falls community. UGM is a beacon of light for those lost in the dark – offering food, shelter, clothing, resources, and spiritual guidance to help people find health, healing, and hope as they work to reclaim their independence. The Mission's work is holistic and rooted in Christian values.

It's always easy to write the news for December because there are so many activities this time of year. The Christmas card ministry is displayed on a table in the fellowship phall and will be collected on December 15.

On November 29 the flower committee has asked that we join them in decorating the church for Advent and Christmas. We will again have the Angel Tree set-up in the fellowship hall. This is a wonderful season and we are reminded to keep Christ in Christmas.

Throughout October we collected rags for the Union Gospel Mission project. We took several loads of bags to the Mission and they were happy to see it. Our rags will be part of the approximately 70,000 pounds of clothing donated each year and will eventually be repurposed to make a cotton blend that is turned into shingles. It is estimated that a truckload will be 35-40 bales, each weighing about 1500 pounds, and will be worth around \$10,000 to the Mission. Not only is the UGM supported financially, but this project also is an opportunity for workers to gain practical mechanical skills. Thank you to everyone who contributed and please continue by taking your discarded clothing to the Union Gospel Mission.
